2.2 Participation and Classroom Regulations

Medium of Instruction

All summer programmes are conducted in **English**. Immerse yourself in the learning environment, and feel encouraged to speak, share, and ask questions.

Attendance

Attendance of all sessions are **mandatory**. Students are expected to **arrive the classroom at least 10 minutes in advance**. For any emergencies or sick leave, please contact the programme coordinator and/or teacher with proof of legitimate reasons for absence (i.e., medical certificate).

There is a minimum requirement of **80% attendance rate**. Those who failed to meet the requirement **will NOT attain** the Certificate of Attendance.

To enhance the summer exchange experience, students are encouraged to actively participate in all activities and collaborate in groups.

Food and Drinks

Students are responsible for maintaining cleanliness in classrooms. Therefore, food and drinks are **NOT allowed**, but water is acceptable.

Handling of Lecture & Teaching Materials

Audio/ video recording or distribution of teaching materials are **NOT permitted**. Intellectual property rights in the contents of the lecture or teaching session or the lecture materials captured belong to the University or to a third party. Ownership of these intellectual property rights is not altered should the lecture, session or materials be recorded.

2.3 Student Visa

Students should have received a **(E-) Student Visa Label** issued by Hong Kong Immigration Department before travelling to Hong Kong.

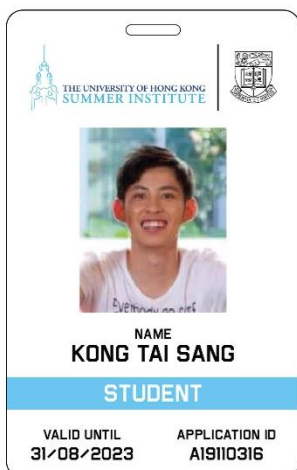
- Overseas and Taiwan students should affix the Visa Label on the passport before landing to Hong Kong.
- Mainland students should bring along the “Exit-entry Permit for Travelling to and from Hong Kong and Macao” (EEP) attached with the Exit Endorsement, as well as the Visa Label to enter Hong Kong directly from the Mainland for activation of his/her student visa.
- Macao students should affix the Visa Label on the "Visit Permit for Residents of Macao SAR to Hong Kong SAR" (Visit Permit) before landing to Hong Kong.

A landing slip will then be issued to you (below is a sample). Your student visa is deemed as valid upon receiving the landing slip together with visa/ entry permit label. Do not lose them throughout your stay in Hong Kong.

The E-student Card contains QR codes to facilitate access to HKU facilities. **Please prepare your E-student Card in advance. You can read the instruction below to login your account.**

University ID card will be issued to students participating in credit-bearing programmes only. This physical card must be kept on hand or in the student's possession throughout the entire programme period. The card also grants access to HKU facilities and will be distributed on the first day of the programme.

2.6 Attire

For General Purposes

Students can dress casually for lectures and tutorials most of the time.

For Special Events or Requirements for Specific Programme(s)

Please ensure you have prepared at least **ONE set of formal or business wear** for attending formal functions, such as High Table Dinner, presentations as required by specific programme.

Ladies: Business suit (including a jacket, trousers, or knee-length skirt) with a blouse/ shirt OR knee-length dress and formal shoes.

Gentlemen: Business suit (including a jacket and pants) with a collared-shirt, tie, and formal shoes.

For Outdoor Activities

Light windbreaker jacket or light-colored t-shirt, comfortable pants, and sports shoes for outdoor activities.



2.7 Bad Weather Arrangement

Under the situations listed below:

1. Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal No. 8 (or above) is hoisted; or
2. Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal No. 8 will be issued within two hours as announced by the Hong Kong Observatory; or
3. “Extreme conditions” after super typhoons are in force (announced by the Government before the Hong Kong Observatory replaces Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal No. 8 with Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal No. 3); or
4. Black Rainstorm Signal is in force,



the following arrangements will apply:

A. For classes and examinations **not yet started**

If any of the warnings or announcements is hoisted or in force AT OR AFTER 6:00 am	All morning classes and examinations commencing BEFORE 2:00 pm will be CANCELLED automatically.
If any of the warnings or announcements is hoisted or in force AT OR AFTER 11:00 am	All afternoon classes and examinations commencing at any time FROM 2:00 pm AND BEFORE 6:00 pm will be CANCELLED automatically.
If any of the warnings or announcements is hoisted or in force AT or AFTER 3:00 pm	All evening classes and examinations commencing FROM 6:00 pm onward will be CANCELLED automatically.

* Individual programmes will receive special arrangements, such as transitioning to Zoom classes. Further notifications will be sent via email in due course.

2.8 Travel Insurance


In any case, you are strongly recommended to make your own insurance arrangements throughout the entire period of your studies in Hong Kong. Students will be responsible for their own medical and dental costs during the period of the programme.

Please check with your insurance agent and ensure that the scheme covers travel / flight delays, theft of personal belongings and medical and health cover for an injury or sudden illness abroad for the programme period.

2.9 Gain Access to HKU Campus

The Tourist Flow Management Scheme has been implemented at HKU since May 1, 2024. This scheme requires all students to possess a valid proof for verification at various university entrances and when requested by campus security personnel.

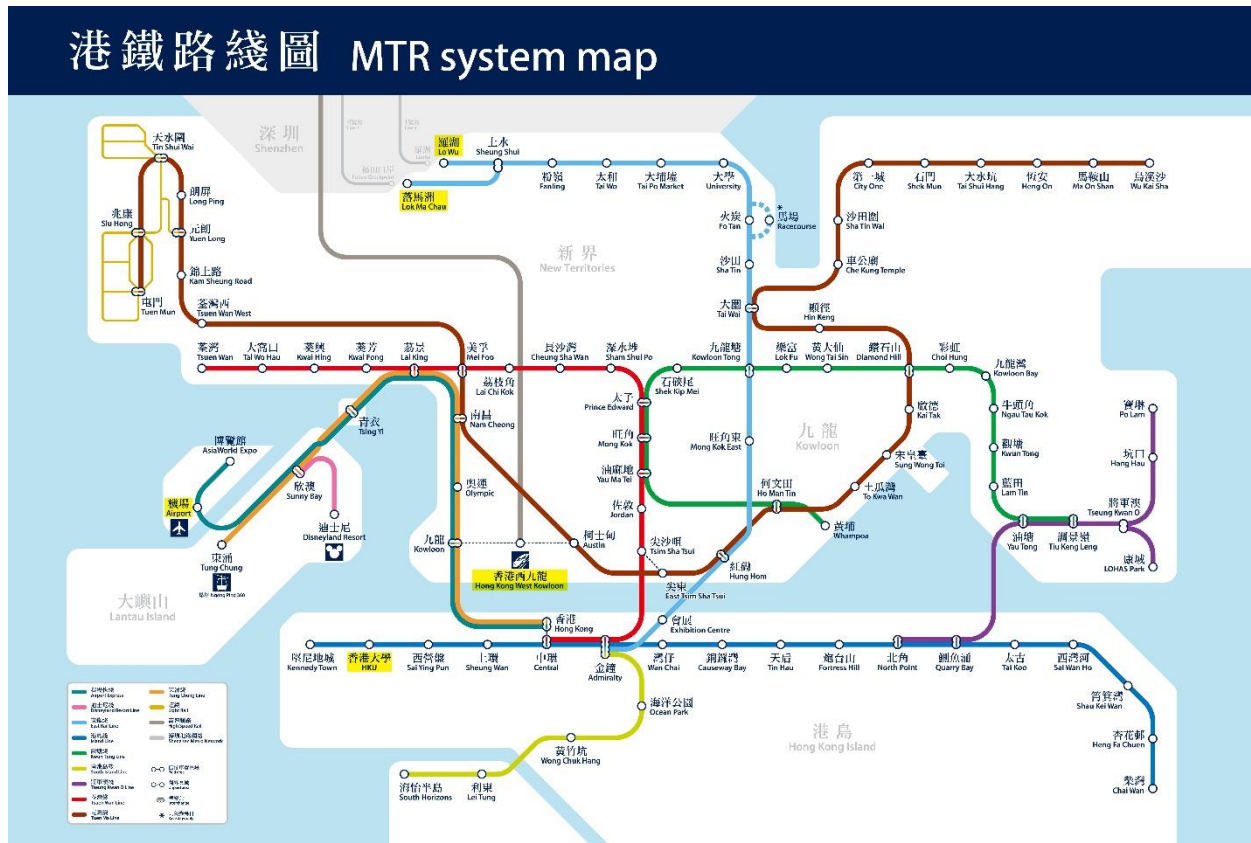

3.1 Travelling from Hong Kong International Airport to HKU Main Campus

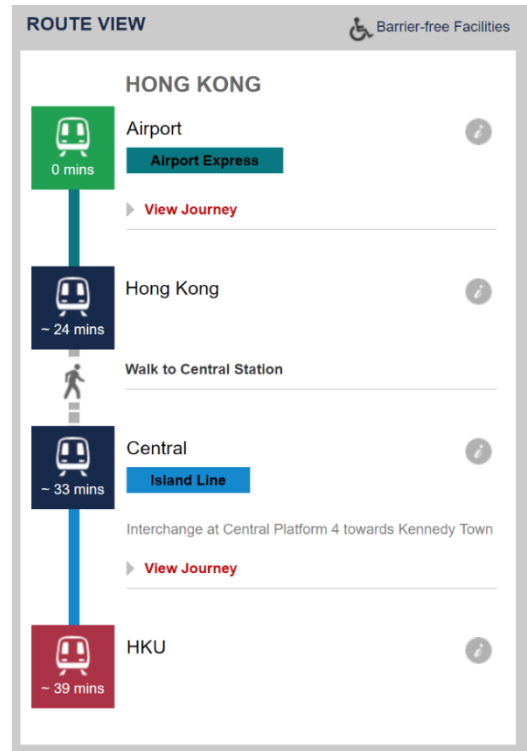
Method 1: By MTR

Airport > Hong Kong Station > Central Station > HKU Main Campus

Take Airport Express from the airport to Hong Kong Station. Change to Island Line (blue) at Central Station to HKU station. Exit from HKU Station Exit A2.

Duration: 40 - 50 minutes

Cost: HKD110 - 121 for Airport Express and MTR fare



Method 2: By Taxi

Airport > HKU Main Campus

Take a taxi directly from the Airport.

Duration: 35 – 40 minutes

Cost: Below HKD400, plus luggage and tunnel fee

Method 3: By Bus

Airport > Western Harbour Crossing Toll Plaza > HKU Main Campus

Take Bus No. A10/ A11/ A12 from Hong Kong International Airport to Western Harbour Crossing Toll Plaza (3rd stop) and change to Bus No. 970/ 970X/ 973 from Western Harbour Crossing Toll Plaza to HKU West Gate (3rd stop).

Duration: 75 minutes

Cost: HKD53 – 64.2

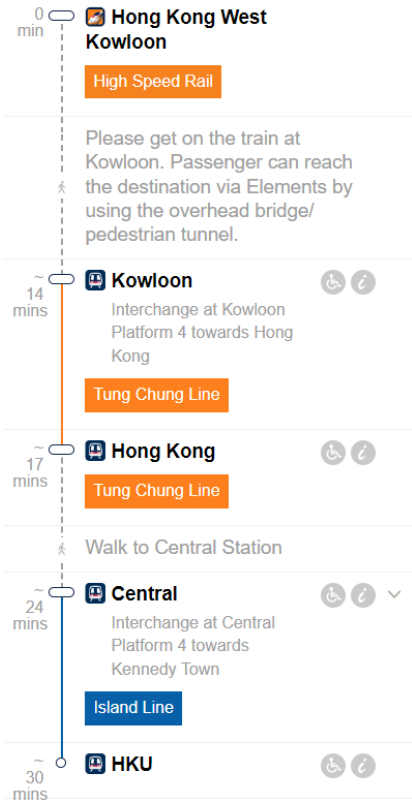

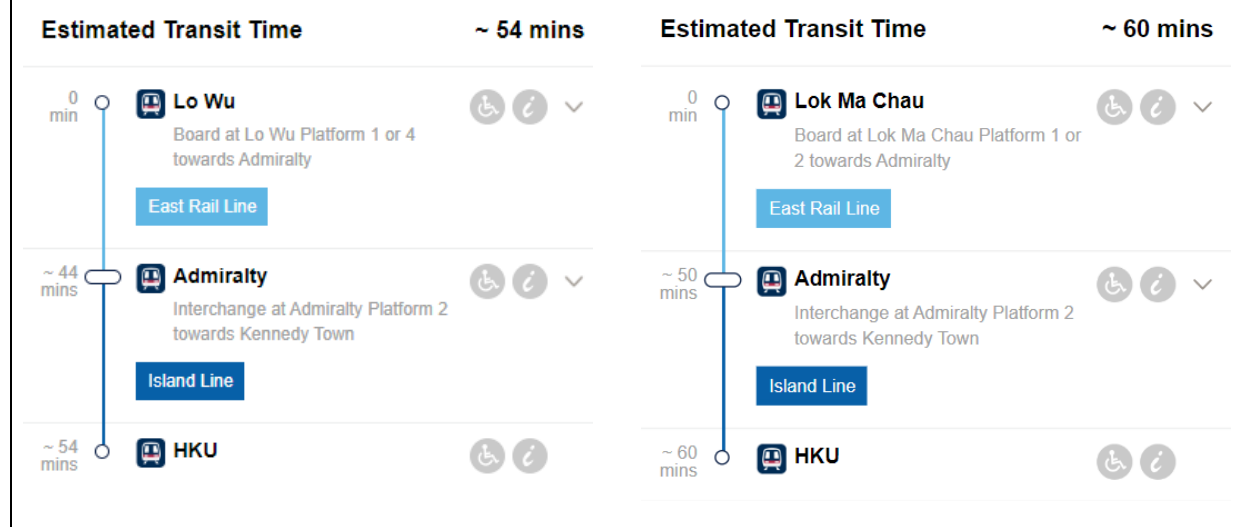

Common Hall Rules:

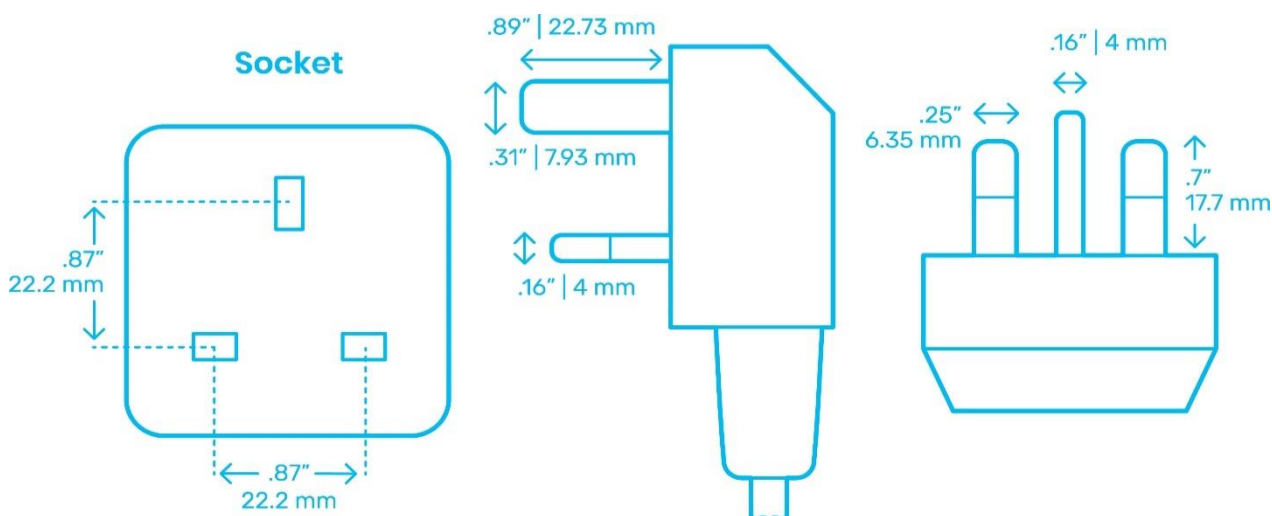
- No smoking, gambling, alcohol, or drugs are allowed.

- Students will be required to sign an Undertaking Form as a declaration of your consent to abide by the Hall Regulations. Upon collection of room key or door password, please read it carefully before signing.

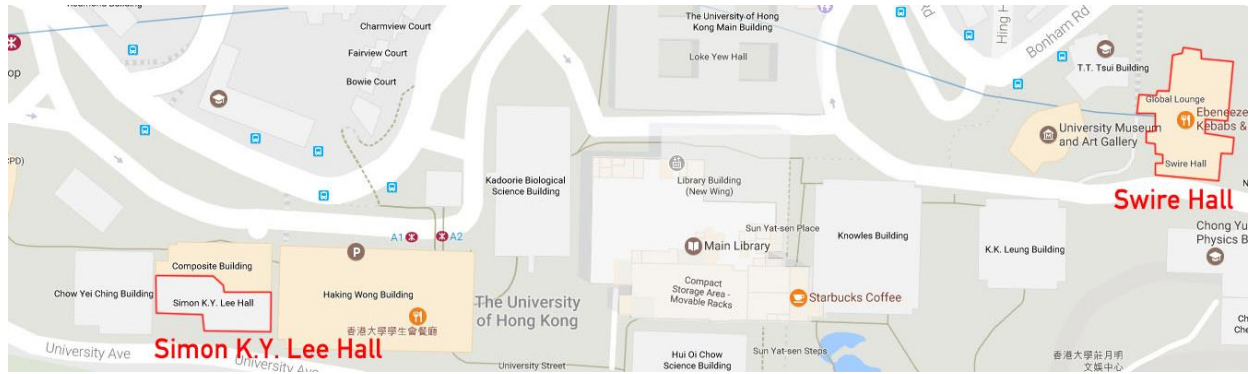
- Check-in: 3:00pm to 6:00pm

Electricity & Voltage:

- The standard electrical voltage in Hong Kong is **220 volts AC, 50HZ**, so you will need an adaptor/ transformer for your non-220-volt appliances and electrical equipment.
- Most electrical sockets/ plugs in Hong Kong take a three-pronged plug (Refer to diagram below) and please bring along one for your usage.

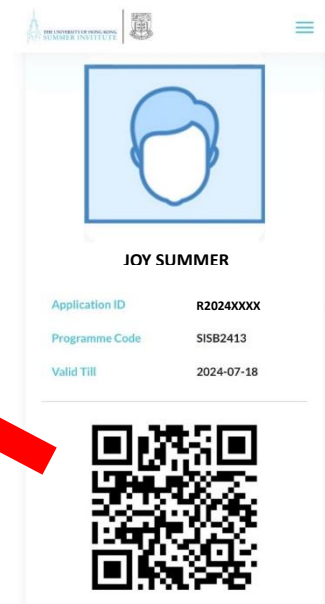

Access gate at G/F



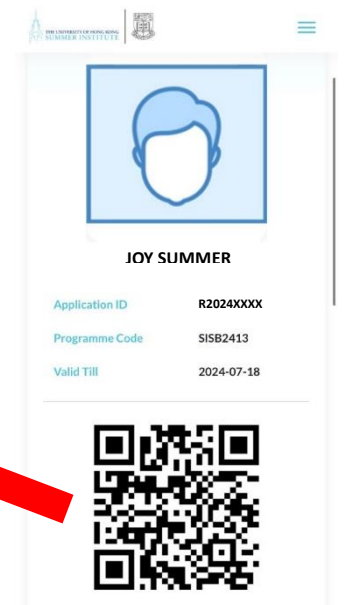

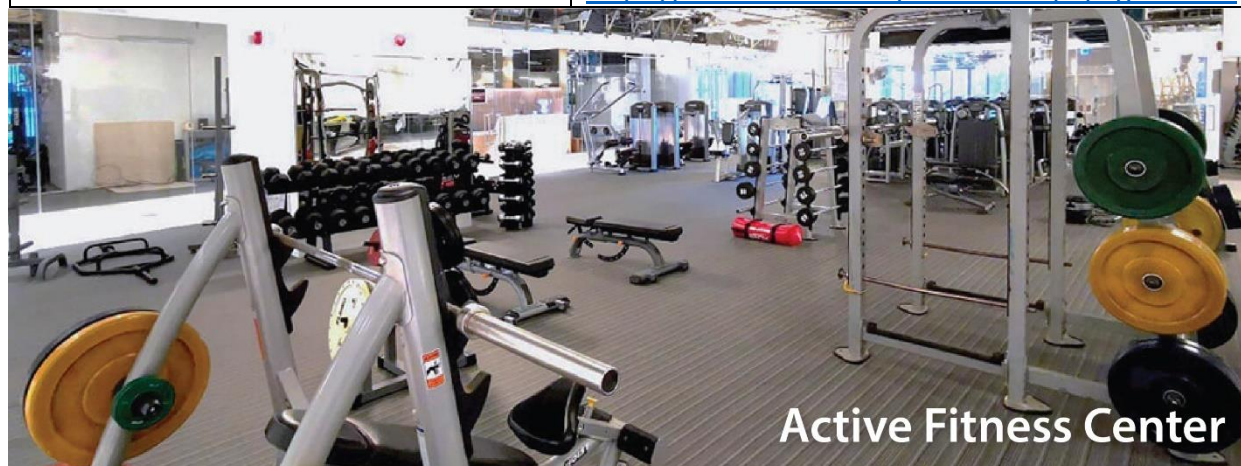

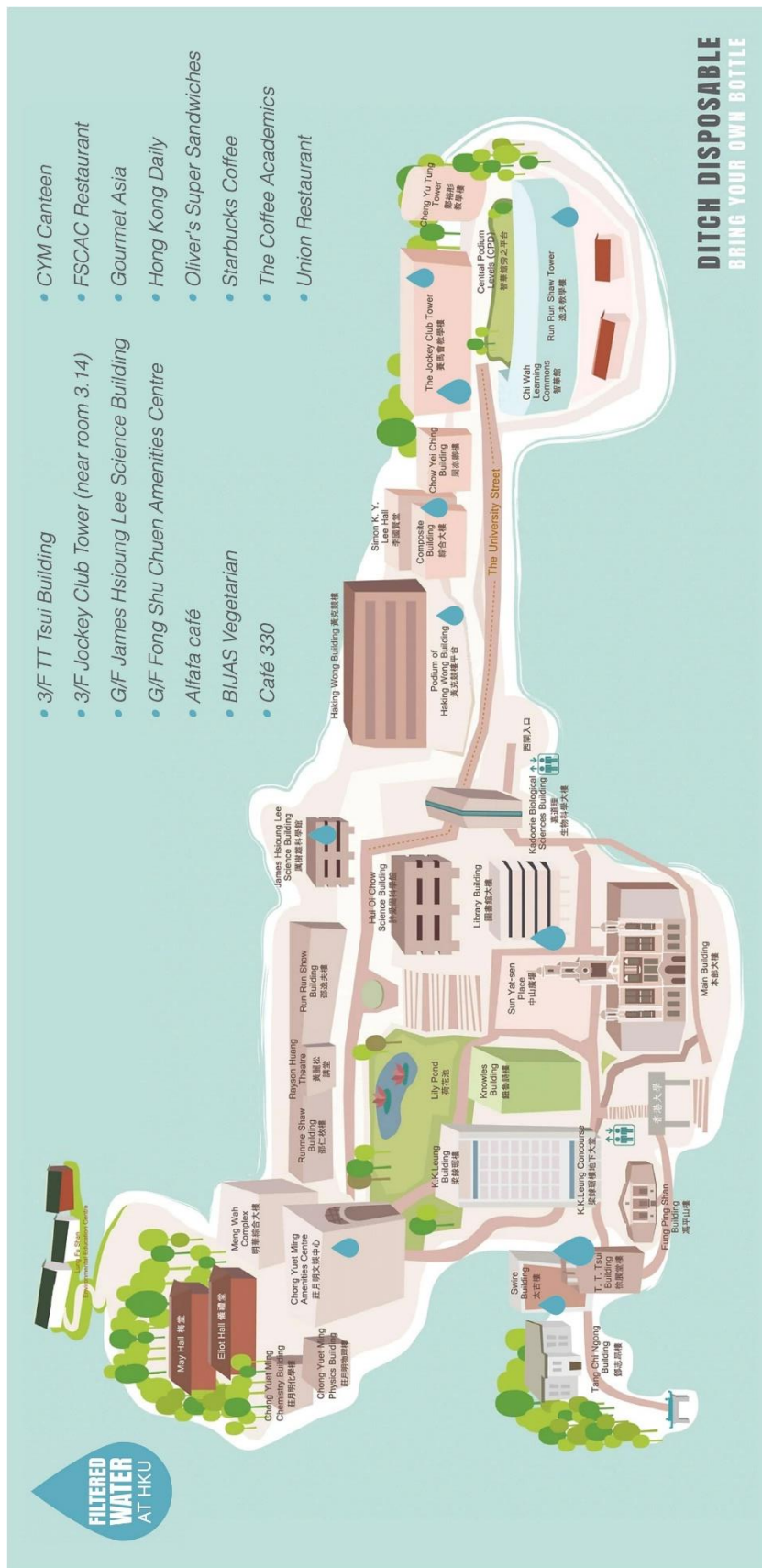
D. Smoke-free Campus

HKU is a **smoke-free campus**. Smoking is prohibited in all areas of the University.

According to the Smoking (Public Health) Ordinance (Cap. 371), smoking or carrying a lighted cigarette, cigar, or pipe in statutory no smoking areas is liable to a **fixed penalty of HK\$1,500**. It applies also to other forms of smoking products, such as waterpipe tobacco, e-cigarettes, and heated tobacco products. Under the Criminal Procedure Ordinance (Cap. 221), it is an offence for any person aiding, abetting, counselling, or procuring others to smoke in no smoking areas.

5.3 Locations of Waters Dispensers

HKU is devoted to eco-friendly practices, minimizing ecological impact, and encouraging sustainable development. Therefore, **single-use plastic bottles are not sold or distributed** on campus. **Bring your reusable bottle!**



5.4 HKU Visitor Centre and Campus Store

Visitor Centre

The HKU Visitor Centre is housed in the Workmen's Quarters of the former Elliot Pumping Station and Filters site of the Water Supplies Department. This red brick rectangular building is one of the two historic buildings marking the entrance of the HKU Centennial Campus.

Constructed in 1918-19, the Workmen Quarters is a single storey brick communal residence with three rooms which housed Chinese workers and watchmen. The building is a representative example of the basic accommodation provided for Chinese workmen on Government works sites. The architectural qualities and scale of this building are simple in nature. It is essentially intact both externally and internally. The Workmen's Quarters Building has been classified as a Grade III historic building and revitalized to become the HKU Visitor Centre.

7.1 Weather in Hong Kong

Hot, humid, and rainy

Hong Kong's climate is sub-tropical with distinct seasons. June to August is summer and typhoon season: hot, humid, and sunny, with occasional showers and thunderstorms. Average temperature from 26°C to 33°C (78.8°F to 87.8°F). Temperature can exceed 33°C and high humidity levels can make it feel even hotter.

However, you are recommended to bring a light windbreaker or cardigan with you as indoor air-conditioned temperature is around 20°C.

7.3 Octopus card

An Octopus card is an essential purchase in Hong Kong. It's a smart payment tool that allows you to travel and pay cash-free at over 170,000 acceptance points, covering an extensive range of public transport, dining, entertainment, shopping, and more.



Students are recommended to purchase an Octopus card upon arrival. There are many types of Octopus cards, including On-Loan Octopus (refundable deposit required), Tourist Sold Octopus (no deposit required), Octopus Mobile SIM (a mobile phone SIM card with embedded Octopus functions), Octopus on iPhone or Apple Watch, Huawei Pay Octopus and Smart Octopus in Samsung Pay, etc. Remaining value can be refunded upon leaving Hong Kong.

The Octopus can be purchased at the following stores within the Hong Kong International Airport on arrival:

1. 7-Eleven (Unit 5T058, Arrivals Meeters & Greeters Hall, or any 7-Eleven outlets)
2. MTR Ticket & Octopus Selling Machine (Airport Station)

A. Telephone

There is no telephone service for students in the residential halls, therefore, please bring your own mobile phone. Most of the world's mobile telecommunications systems operate in Hong Kong, including GSM 900, PCS 1800, LTE, CDMA and WCDMA networks, as well as 3G, 4G and 5G. Thus, all tri-band or quad-band compatible phones will work with local SIM cards. SIM cards can be easily purchased at any convenience store.

B. Internet Service
